Our Grade Fives will be participating in a great environmental program this week called, Green Bricks. Thanks to our grade five teachers for organizing this for our students.

"This 60-minute interactive science workshop engages students to understand the concept of zero waste in our region and globally. We raise student awareness on issues such as Metro Vancouver's Zero Waste Challenge and how we can re-frame garbage to become a future resource. Workshop topics include the 3Rs, in particular, how important it is to reduce and re-use our resources, including the "how to" for recycling and composting, and solutions for sustainable waste management in our built environment. We focus on helping students learn what can and cannot go in the municipal organics program, changes to recycling that affect BC and to explore issues around the curricular economy."
